



Bhutan's culture is manifest through religious festivals. While the festivals take place throughout the year in various locations, the biggest ones are the annual Thimphu (capital city) festival, Paro festival, Jambay Lhakhang Drup and the Gomphu Kora festival. Birds of Paradise

The sheer diversity of Bhutan's bird species, and the ease of spotting them, should quicken the pulse of any birding enthusiast. The White-bellied Heron is considered critically endangered so rare, in fact, that from the estimated global population of 50 to 200, 32 are believed to be in Bhutan.

Bhutan's has close to 800 bird species of which 26 species are considered globally threatened or vulnerable. Bhutan also has numerous other globally endangered bird species including the Himalayan Monal, Ward's Trogon, Beautiful Nuthatch, Blyth's Tragopan, Pallas's Fish Eagle, Chestnut-breasted Partridge, Wood Snipe, Rufous-necked Hornbill, Yellow-rumped Honeyguide, and Blyth's Kingfisher.








Traditional Sports Tour

In Bhutan, if you hear unfettered high-pitched shrieks and laughter, then an archery match is underway. Come the festivals or national holidays or even the ordinary weekends, they come with bamboo bows and narrows, about a dozen archers in each team to contest village against village, one town against another and one district versus the other. The stake: pride and ego. Even the gods and deities are invoked to help win the tournament. We arrange such matches combined with the usual other accompaniments for our guests. The experience is enthralling to say the least!









Rafting and Fishing Tour

Apart from the mouth-watering challenges of trekking in the Himalayas, rafting and kayaking have emerged as the reasons for visiting Bhutan these days. The country's streams and rivers - running furiously down mountainsides, through jagged ravines and gorges, across moraine valleys, quaint hamlets on the banks, and other spectacular natural beauties along the way – provide the perfect setting for these water sports. You can combine it with fishing too; the rivers are laden with trout, carp and other local species. Fly fishing is very popular.













Farmhouse Tour

The essence of Bhutan lies in the villages. They preserve much of what Bhutan was in the past, by way of customs, the regimens of day-to-day life as well as the peace and the quiet of a life that has changed very little for over a thousand years. Our guests not only get to observe this lifestyle which has vanished elsewhere but actually partake in the proceedings like cooking and dining, helping on the farms, and sleeping in a mud-rammed house. Helicopter Tour

One can get faster to New York from Bhutan than from one end of the kingdom to the other. It is simply because the roads are long and meandering given the mountainous topography. So it takes days to reach Trashigang in the east from Paro in the west. Helicopter flights enable you to see the entire country in a span of an hour or two – the enigmatic Himalayas, dubbed the abode of the Gods – in a spectacular fashion. The flight is worth every cent you pay. The views are simply awe-inspiring. For the best bargain, you can spend a few days on the road too, seeing the country at close quarters.









Safari Tours

For wildlife enthusiasts, a trip to the Manas sanctuary in the south of Bhutan is a must. The sanctuary is a treasurehouse of threatened wild animals such as the Asiatic elephant, one-horned rhinoceros, the Bengal Tiger, Leopard, etc. In fact, the santuary has the largest cat species in the world in one area. it adjoins the Manas sanctuary in the Indian state of Assam which has been declared as a UNESCO heritage site. The best way to scour the area is to take an elephant safari. Manas is also famous for a huge array of tropical and sub-tropical bird species.









Butterfly Tour

Bhutan ranks in the top 10% of countries in terms of species richness per area unit. With about 900 species, Bhutan has more butterfly species than the whole of North America (679 species) and the whole of Europe (440). Of these, 140 species have been catalogued with photographs. The most popular among these is the Bhutan Glory, the national butterfly.

The diversity of butterfly species can be attributed to the terrain with some flying as high as 5000m above the sea level. Butterflies are indicators of environmental health and diversity. When host plants disappear, butterflies thriving in that habitat also disappear. Therefore the number of species of butterflies in Bhutan makes the Himalayan kingdom an ecological hotspot.









Back to the Nature

Bhutan is the only country which has a clause in its Constitution stating that 60% of the total area should be kept under forest cover for all times. It is also the only country that has stated to the world that it will remain a net carbon sink in perpetuity.

A recipient of numerous environmental awards, Bhutan is blessed with abundant bounties of nature. It has over 800 known species of butterflies, yet another 800 species of birds, more than 5,00 species of orchids, and and 50 species of rhododendron alone. For a tiny country, it has more than 200 species of mammals not to mention other plants and animals that are yet to be discovered.

The whole country indeed is one big park. As a conscious policy, Bhutan has dedicated one-third of its area as national parks and biological corridors to benefit mankind as a whole.

Norter Adventures believes that there is so much the outside world can learn from Bhutan as far as environment is concerned. Vital Information

Visa:

All foreign nationals must obtain visa clearance through us before travelling to Bhutan. The actual visa is stamped upon your arrival. The Tourism Council of Bhutan approves your visa clearance only after receiving the full tour payment including the visa fee of USD 40 along with a scanned colour photocopy of your passport which should be at least six months valid. Nationals of India, Maldives and Bangladesh do not need visa.

Entry points

Take a flight to Paro, Bhutan, anywhere from Kathmandu, Nepal, New Delhi/Kolkata/Guwahati/Bagdogra, India, Bangkok, Thailand, or Singapore. Or take the road through the India-Bhutan border at Jaigaon-Phuentsholing, Dadgari-Gelephu, Guwahati-Samdrup Jongkhar.

Tariff

The tariff for group of 3 or more:

 USD \$200 per person per night for January, February, June, July, August, December. USD \$250 per person per night for March, April, May, September, October, November.

Surcharges

 For a single person, a surcharge of USD 40 per night will be added; for a group of two persons a surcharge of USD 30 per night per person will be added; for a single supplement, USD 40 a night will be added.

Tariff includes

- A minimum of 3-star accommodations, one room sharing basis (4 & 5-star require an additional premium).
- · All meals
- Guide services
- All internal transport/sightseeing
- Camping equipment and haulage for trekking tours.
- All internal taxes, fees and charges
- Tourism royalty of USD 65.
